lent me the morning that I got
home on furlough. Then I believe

sheep, I don't know that I owe any
body else anything in the money line,
but arrange that matter to quit your
self, I am "not particular" as the fellow
said, I am in good health and at the
same old place yet, last evening I
received a letter from Philo he is
not very well, but seems to be in
good spirits, he thinks he can stand it
four months longer, at which time

he proposes to meet me in old
Hebron. I say "agreed" and then
at that time nervous people must
not get about us. so got a bit of it,
I am feeling frustrate as you will
see by this. but time is moving
slow, slow indeed. Richmond
and Lee's army have gone up
and I am in hopes that a few of
the boys in "blue" will soon
not be wanted any more, hoping
this may find you all in good
health I will close my regards
to all write soon and oblige
